### Hurricane Sandy ✓

- Category 5 hurricane
- Sea levels had risen 1 foot along the New York and New Jersey coast in the past 100 years.

### Johnstown Flood ✓

- due to excessive rain and flooding, a dam broke spilling 20 million tons of water
- Poor maintenance of the dam

- 148 direct deaths
- Caused \$68 billion dollars in damages
- Affected 24 states
- Has been linked to climate change
- Shut down transportation and commerce along Eastern Seaboard.
- Shut down Stock Exchange on Wall Street (NYSE)

### Dust Bowl ✓

- drought
- extensive "deep plowing" displacing natural grasses.
- mechanization of farming equipment.

- affected 100,000,000 acres.
- centered in the panhandle of Texas and Oklahoma and adjacent sections of New Mexico, Colorado and Kansas.
- caused a mass exodus of farmers to California

**September 11<sup>th</sup>, 2001**

- Al Qaeda and Bin Laden cited: U.S Support of Israel, the presence of U.S troops in Saudi Arabia and Sanctions against Iraq

**Pearl Harbor**

- preventative offensive action by the empire of Japan to prevent US resistance to its expansionism. Policy

- 2,402 killed, 1,247 wounded
- Led the U.S into World War II

**Love Canal**

- Hooker Chemical company sold the contaminated site to the Niagara Falls School Board for \$1 in 1953, explicitly detailing the waste buried there.

- Hooker Chemical was found negligent in their disposal of the waste, but not in the sale of the land.
- Residents of Love Canal living on or near toxic waste dump developed an assortment of ailments. Cancers and birth defects which drew national attention to the environmental debate.

**Exxon Valdez**

- Third mate, not using proper navigation, equipment while drunk
- Captain slept in his cabin
- Ship ran aground in Prince William Sound, Alaska

- \$20,000 - 750,000 barrels of oil dumped into "Untouched" wilderness occupying 111,000 square miles impacting 1300 miles of shoreline.

- Led to U.S military involvement in Iraq and Afghanistan
- 2,996 died, 600 injured
- U.S expanded anti-terrorism.

### BP Gulf Fire

- Explosion on oil rig in Gulf of Mexico led to the death of 11 oil well workers.
- The damaged platform released the flow of oil into the Gulf of Mexico.

### Oklahoma City Bombing

- Timothy McVeigh and others associated with extremist anti-government sympathizers designed a bomb to be used in the attack of a federal building on the anniversary of the ATF assault on the Branch Davidians Compound outside of Waco, TX.

### Branch Davidians

- Allegations of polygamy, statutory rape, illegal weapons, and other crimes were being presented in the press related to the "Cult of Branch" Davidians.
- The ATF, local law enforcement, and National Guard raided the compound which resulted in a fire that destroyed the compound and killed the residents.

• 4.9 million barrels of oil spilled covering 2,500 to 68,000 square miles.

• The bombing claimed 168 lives, and injured more than 680, this led to deeper investigation into domestic extremist terrorist organizations.

• Increased protection of federal buildings.

• Became a rallying point for the extreme right as to abuse of power by the Federal Government.

• Lead directly to the Oklahoma City bombing required government committees to investigate the actions of the U.S. government as to their involvement in the raid and its consequences.

## Jonestown

CULT under the increasing paranoid leadership of Jim Jones demands and administers all of his followers to drink poisoned juice after his compound has been visited by California politicians, following up on reports of members being forced to remain at Jonestown against their will. These same politicians and laws then were drawn down at an airstrip prior to the poisoning.

Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold planned and executed an act of mass murder upon high school classmates.

- 918 members of the People's Temple commit suicide or are murdered at the instruction of their leader Jim Jones.
- Brings to light a new phenomena in American culture the Charismatic cults of the doomsday cults.
- Largest single loss of American civilian life in a non-disaster until 9/11/01.

## DDT

A very effective pesticide, DDT was used throughout the U.S.

Through research and looks like silent spring of Rachel Carson, devastating effects of DDT its widespread use was questioned since the chemical.
